## "SPEAKING THE TRUTH IN LOVE"

A Covenant for Christian Communication\* (adopted by FFC Church Council 11/10/20)

"...speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." (Ephesians 4:15-16)

As members of the Franklin Federated Church,

## We will speak...

- a. We will communicate <u>calmly and directly</u> to each other using the first person. (For example, in response to someone saying words that "sting," we might say, "I know it's not your intention, but when you said X, I felt hurt [or dismissed or attacked or put down.]")
- b. We will <u>listen without interrupting</u> (unless someone is breaking this covenant and needs to be asked to rephrase or take a "time out" to cool down).
- c. We will <u>ask questions</u> for clarification in order to confirm that we have understood correctly and ask others to do the same.
- d. We will <u>value all opinions</u> and recognize that everyone is equally important.
- e. We will communicate with each other <u>as if we were standing face-to-face with</u> <u>Jesus</u>, asking what would God have us do, and seeking God's voice in the other person.
- f. We will <u>take responsibility</u> for our own speech, stopping ourselves if/when we notice our own words escalating tension or breaking this covenant.
- g. We will recognize that our words--and how they are presented--<u>have</u> <u>consequences.</u>

## The truth...

- a. We will be as <u>honest</u> as we can with each other.
- b. We will strive together to understand and speak from <u>factual information</u>, rather than leaping to conclusions based on assumptions or speculation.
- c. We will speak only for ourselves, not speculating about what others may think.

## In love...

- a. We will speak to each other with <u>respect.</u>
- b. We will <u>affirm the merit</u> in another person's idea or concern before we note its weaknesses.
- c. We will <u>open our minds and listen</u> to understand one another's point of view, but <u>don't necessarily have to agree.</u>
- d. We will <u>honor an apology</u> by listening, responding, and making a sincere effort to forgive, asking for God's grace and strength to help us.
- e. We will <u>love one another</u> and love people where they are in their journey.
